1. WELCOME, INTRODUCTIONS AND APOLOGIES

CD welcomed everyone to the meeting and around the table introductions were made. Apologies were noted.

2. REVIEW OF REMIT, MEMBERSHIP, MEETING CYCLE AND REPORTING MECHANISM TO DUNDEE PARTNERSHIP

CD shared with the group a flow chart detailing the sub-groups of the Cultural Development Strategic Group. Discussion was held on which sub-groups still meet and what else needs to be included. New Sub Groups to be considered include Heritage, Community Engagement and Performing Arts (potentially in place of Dance).

Action: CD to follow up with EH-F and AP on sub groups and with BB regarding previous mapping out across engagement/learn departments. To update the remits of Development Group and its sub-groups.

Discussions followed around schools and youth engagement, the importance of the independent sector and artists voice and on comms which has been taken on by the Tourism Partnership Group. CD to consider how to engage young people and Liam Sinclair and CD to look at stakeholder map to weight up capacity and effort in reporting

3. COLLABORATION, COMMUNICATION AND ADVOCACY

Discussed as part of item 2 with a focus on stakeholder reporting to the city plan, and how communications flow between sub groups and Cultural Development Group.

CD noted that from February there will be a slide for culture included in the Quarterly Economic Update which is circulated to the Fair Work and Enterprise Board, Council Leadership Team, City Dev management team, elected members, politicians, city leaders and large businesses in Dundee.

4. CULTURE STRATEGY PLANNING

CD outlined headings and questions as per the document issued for the meeting. The group reiterated the need for ambition to think like a capital city, to be international in outlook.

Action: CD to ask small steering group to support.

5. ROUND TABLE UPDATES

LACD – there is a new Leisure and Culture Dundee Strategic Plan

Creative Dundee – are working on the challenge of creative spaces, and on the Changemakers project and creative networks.

Dundee Heritage Trust – are working on a strategic and financial review

Dundee Rep and Scottish Dance Theatre – have just completed a six month project in Perth prison for prisoners and their families, SDT's Pirates is opening in London and they've hot target on Christmas Carol sales.

V&A Dundee – there's an overhaul of the display in the galleries and a change in how the galleries are being used. Tomorrow is budget day and there should be news on annual funds from Government.

Hot Chocolate – there has been some staffing redeployment and restructure leaving Andy as the only arts officer.

Schools Music Service – thousands of young people are accessing weekly music lessons, they are working on modules of screen education and craft for schools

Abertay/CoSTAR – there's a new Vice Chancellor at Abertay and there's a new volunteering opportunity for staff to spend time volunteering. CoSTAR is due to be open by summer

Dundee Science Centre – the theme for February's festival is Inspire, Explore and Play. They are part of a wider measuring impact project for learning centres.

University of Dundee – are working on a capital project for DJCAD and working through impact of raac. Also working on an Urban Re-leaf project, starting a Dundee chapter of the national Saturday Clubs and the Discovery Days are in January.

UNESCO City of Design Dundee – some staff changes as Poppy moves on to UNESCO Perth, and looking at how to connect in the New Year.
