4507	A TED style conference, illuminating, inspiring and helping people around the world to grow and develop.	
4513	Artisan Weekend Market in the Stak Leisure Car-Park.	
4531	A floating pavilion in City Quay, like the one in Rotterdam.	
4540	Greater connections within and between the cities green spaces (existing and those which will be created through development sites)	
4544	A contemporary music festival at Camperdown park. Radio 1's big weekend in Dundee was a huge success but nothing has been held since.	
4546	A marked walking trail, taking in all historical and cultural parts of the City (like the Freedom Trail in Boston, Mass.) with maps and detailed information.	
4600	The World of Dundee/Dundee in the World. An invitation to other towns/cities called Dundee to send representatives to THE Dundee on a set date. At the same time inviting expatriates from around the world to attend the 'World Gathering of the Dundonians' they could then gather in the town square in view of the city webcam and send greetings to the world.	
4607	Free big screen film nights in the City Square or other locations (with a Dundee connection). A giant Beano comic using real kids (not quite thought this through, but it could maybe form a giant live Beano photoshoot - a living comic strip.)	
4637	Productions from the Edinburgh fringe. Exhibitions from the V&A. A marina in Dundee. More restaurants overlooking the Tay	
4641	An outdoor drive-in cinema/live performance area using Camperdown House as the backdrop/focus. This could easily rival Somerset House in London.	
4645	Bio - Collosus. David Mach's 90-foot nude women, 'protecting' the entry to DJCAD.	
4663	Large illuminated sign on rear of Caird Hall saying WELCOME TO DUNDEE Which will be seen as people cross the Tay Bridge, so inviting them in to Dundee	
4697	a City Centre museum to DC Thomson comics and personalities. A sure fire winner as an attraction !	
4716	a cultural cafe/restaurant/bar where local people can have a pop-up restaurant serving different tastes of the world every week/month!

4723	A 'Green week' where the city very actively tries to reduce the electricity used. Turn off the shop lights after closing time, replace their light with solar powered lamps to increase safety (Dundee is Scotland's sunniest city, lets make use of it!), have a 'Green fair' in the city centre, have people plant fruit trees in public areas and allow people to eat the fruit like the Food Forest in Seattle. Each day, sponsor a different endangered species that's not as well known as the Tiger or Panda, something that will surprise, engage and concern people.	
4758	Green roofs. Kids and adults would love the chance to get up onto some of the flat roofs of the city centre and plant some small plants, e.g. throw down grass seeds, wild flowers and mosses. Many of these flat roofs are visible from the University's Tower building making the view of the city more interesting. Many of the University buildings have flat roofs that could be brightened up with some greenery.	
4762	I'd like to see a series of "Country Fairs" in City Square where each ethnic group in Dundee showcases their language, food, art, culture and customs. I'm thinking Polish, Turkish, Chinese, Indian, Pakistani (and perhaps even English!) for starters, there may be others.	
4792	Magdalen Green with a refurbished playpark and with the bandstand repaired and renovated to its former glory. The Green, which is Dundee's oldest public park, is in a wonderful location is much loved and very well used but it needs capital investment. Last century the Green lost its swimming pool, railway station, tennis courts and bowling green, all it gained was a bit more car park, it's time to put something back!	
4836	A celebration of Dundee's big trees. This could be an online guide to where to find the city's most impressive specimen trees and the trees could be decorated with ribbons or lights.	
4998	Posters around Edinburgh and Glasgow which tell the great story of what Dundee is. Almost nobody in these cities has ever been to Dundee, and it would inspire them both to go and visit Dundee, but also to aspire for greater things where they live.	
5033	Widespread, large scale, planting of perennial wildflower meadows throughout the city, filling waste-ground and roadsides, softening the urban landscape and bringing a huge diversity of wildlife right into built up areas. Neighbourhood involvement to identify and sow neglected areas of ground. Different species mixes in different parts of the city. On such a scale, it would set Dundee apart from every other UK city.	
5041	the city's fathers pay homage to the once separate villages of Broughty Ferry & Downfield, using photographic & Council records covering their respective histories, ending with plays written either locally or as an international prize, showing the months leading up to their annexation by the growing Dundee.

5042	an open air theatre (similar to The Globe), with emphasis on being environmentally-friendly, and where period plays could be held, with a strong emphasis on the city's highly rated Rep Ensemble, backed up by travelling productions and local enthusiasts.	
5049	A Beano or Dandy character theme 'treasure hunt' event like recent Gromit Unleashed event around Bristol. Great way for locals and tourist to see different parts of the city and great way to raise funds for local charity!	
5051	Dundee have a pedestrianised cultural quarter, the square at the Rep would be ideal. Block off the top of South Tay Street, build on the car park and pedestrianise the whole street, from Park Place to the Nethergate. Get in quality book shops, small Indy retailers, stuff like that, the pubs are there already, where people could just chill out.	
5055	Simple Minds kicking off an outdoor Dundee 2017 concert opposite the V&A Dundee (with Light Night effects) pumping out "Waterfront"	
5073	Exhibitions put on (with projects linked to local school and community participation) about various aspects of Dundee's history and archaeology. Involving museums, archaeological organisations and heritage trusts and schemes. From Mary Shelley living in Dundee in her adolescence; to Arctic Shipbuilding; Whaling; the building of the Tay Bridge; DC Thompson; the Mills and Manufacturing, There is so much variety in Dundee's heritage that is exemplary of the international importance of and contributions it has made and would clearly show why it thoroughly deserves to be given the title of City of Culture for 2017.	
5092	the War Memorial on top of the Law hill illuminated every night, in the nation's colours of red, white and blue.	
5103	An Ironman event in Dundee. This long-distance race requires easy access to water for (a 2+ mile swim), a 100+ mile bicycle ride, culminating in a Marathon.	
5124	Recognition of the work of Mina Fleming who made important discoveries in astronomy which are still used today and of James Henderson, first Astronomer Royal. Mina has a small mention in the McManus Museum.	
5148	The city stage a weekly movie night in the larger park for all city residents and family to attend during summer time for 2-3 months. Large projector, sound system, and confection stands, people can bring their own blankets/chairs and enjoy family friendly communal movie nights!!	
5163	Cultural Prescribing - where GPs link patients with people who will accompany them to the cinema, dance classes, knitting circles, exhibitions, the football or concerts	
5165	An exhibition of the Gabrielle Keiller collection. Keillers not only made jam, they could afford to have Andy Warhol paint their doggie.	
5176	paving stones dotted around the City Centre Of famous Dundonians thru history.	
5210	Verdant Works used more for contemporary textile art exhibitions and workshops. There is a wealth of talent in Dundee and Scotland generally.	
5211	A Dundee version of the Cow Parade. Statues of Dundee icons such as Oor Wullie, Desperate Dan etc customised by local artists and spread throughout the city.

5221	sculptures of Broons characters throughout the city (like Edinburgh had the cows) which would encourage people to find them and hence explore the wider city	
5223	2017 is the 150th anniv of Dundee Trades Union Council, which is still running. An exhibition would commemorate this & the role which trades unions have played in Dundee's history, illustrated by items in the City's collections such as the 18th century Lochee Weavers' banner. This could be broadened to include Dundee's history of political radicalism, from the Friends of Liberty in the 1790s, through the chartists to major figures such as Bob Stewart, George Barnes and Mary Brooksbank, possibly touching on the city's 19th century links with Henry George and Krishna Menon's selection as a parliamentary candidate in 1939	
5239	Dundee offered the opportunity of hosting the Turner Art Prize. We're surely worthy through having one of the top 5 art schools in Britain in Dundee.	
5245	A DC Thomson tourist trail of cartoon characters with statues and installations designed to be amenable for kids and families photographs.	
5258	a waterfront location Comics Museum (built out into the Tay ?) dedicated to DC Thomson's world-famous cartoon characters, making use of what must be a hugely impressive treasure trove of material retained over the years, displaying their first edition comics, artists' story lines, etc. Coffee, restaurant and souvenir shop facilities on site. Seek to recreate the atmosphere of the early days, with tours of the museum by modern day Dudley Watkins, and so on.	
5278	A celebration of Dundee's Mills Observatory- the only free and public observatory in the UK. Have an additional building put opposite with planetarium and visitors centre to encourage more people to star gaze and learn about the cosmos. With night bus to and from the Balgay Hill to Clark's all-night working demonstration bakery in the centre.	
5292	A "Great Scot!" Exhibition near Captain Scott's Discovery. A world class and modern show case of ALL Scottish inventions through the years and on-going, from steam engine, bicycle, TV, telephone, radar, vacuum flask, fridge, toaster, fax machine etc. AND Dundee's own with stamps (James Chalmers), light bulbs (James Bowman Lindsay) and marmalade (Janet Keiller). This would show the world what Scotland has done and is still doing. Why there is not one in Edinburgh or Glasgow is in Dundee's benefit!
